Issue Content

This issue was raised at the Markets and Reliability Committee meeting just prior to the indicative stakeholder vote on the Quadrennial Review. The work is intended to address if and at what point, PJM should consider local considerations, such as state or local policy and regulations, to be accounted for in the development of the Net Cost of New Entry (CONE) for the reference resource.

Key Work Activities and Scope

- 1. Provide education on the following topics:
 - a. Current Tariff, Operating Agreement and Manual requirements regarding the development of Net CONE
 - b. Examples of current local considerations, such as state or local policy and regulations, that may need to be accounted for when developing Net CONE
 - c. How other ISOs/RTOs who have capacity markets account for local considerations.
- Discuss the need for modifications to the defined CONE Areas and the development of <u>the</u> Net CONE <u>containing subareas impacted</u> by local conditions and propose modifications, if necessary.
- 3. Identify, examine and develop any necessary changes to existing PJM business rules to accommodate the potential solution(s) for this issue.

Expected Deliverables

- 1. Proposed revisions to Manual 18.
- 2. Proposed revisions to PJM's Tariff and the Operating Agreement, resulting in a FERC filing.
