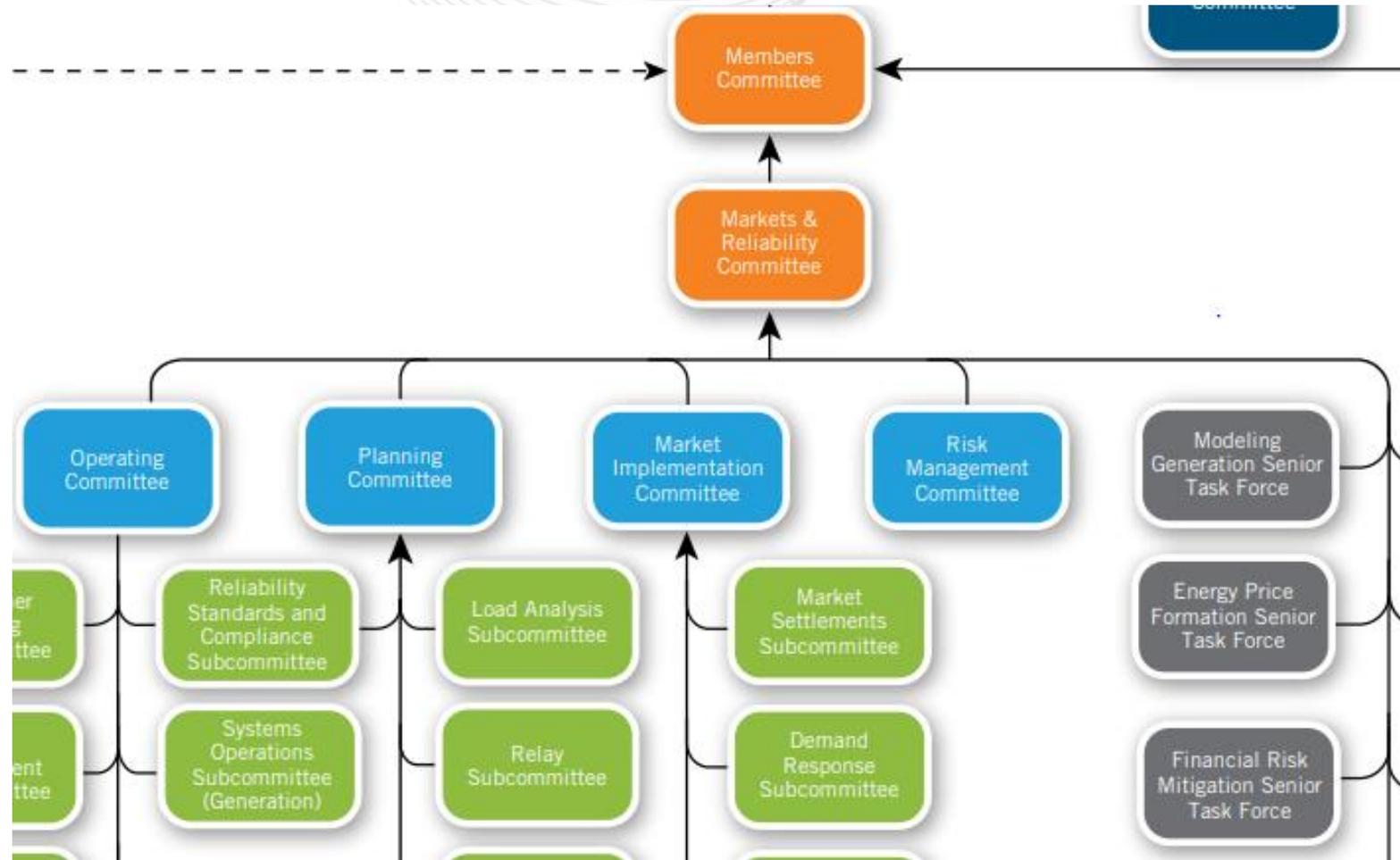


Stakeholder Process and Governing Document Revisions

Stakeholder Process Group Structure



- Voting results are binding and require two thresholds to be met in order to move forward to a senior committee:
 - Simple majority support (> 50% support)
 - Preference over status quo (> 50% support)
- The proposal endorsed with the highest simple majority support moves forward as the Main Motion; other proposals >50% move forward as alternate motions in rank order.
- Once endorsed proposals are collectively owned by the group (not the proposer) for any subsequent actions.

- Proposals from a subordinate group are deemed moved by that collective group and no second is required.
- The subordinate stakeholder group representative makes presentation before general discussion ensues.
- Alternate Motions not forwarded by the lower group must be germane to the specific issue and require a mover and second.

- Voting at the MRC
 - Voting will occur in truncated, sequential order beginning with the Main Motion.
 - Voting is sector-weighted
 - Under truncated voting, voting will stop once a motion passes and the remaining options are not voted on.

- Governing Document revisions are developed once a Main Motion has been determined by vote at the Standing Committee or Sr. Task Force.
 - Multiple versions of governing documents are not developed.
 - Governing documents will accompany the Main Motion at the MRC
 - Endorsement of governing document revisions will be sought at the MRC and MC
